QUESTION ONE - (24 MARKS)

Case Study: Curriculum Redesign in Kenya

Background:

In 2020, the Kenya Institute of Curriculum Development (KICD) initiated a comprehensive review of the national curriculum to address emerging challenges in education, including the need for more critical thinking, creativity, and digital literacy among students. The goal was to develop a curriculum that was more relevant to the 21st century while aligning with national educational goals.

Situation:

KICD gathered a panel of educators, policymakers, and community stakeholders to participate in workshops aimed at co-creating a new curriculum framework. They focused on incorporating local culture, improving student engagement, and ensuring inclusivity for learners with diverse needs.

Challenges Identified:

1. Resistance from some educators accustomed to traditional teaching methods.
2. Limited resources for implementing new technologies in classrooms.
3. Varying levels of parental support and understanding of the new curriculum objectives.

Implementation:

After months of collaboration, a new curriculum was drafted. Pilot programs were established in

select schools to test its effectiveness. Feedback was collected through surveys and focus group discussions with teachers, students, and parents.

Outcome:

The pilot programs revealed positive engagement from students and improvements in critical thinking
